CHILDREN AND YOUTH

- Invest in early learning programming for parents and children to strengthen their foundation for school readiness.
- Ensure children and youth are engaged with the community in reaching their full potential.
- Promote greater integration of community-wide services and resources so there is "Every Door is the Right Door" for parents, children and youth.

NEIGHBOURHOOD REVITALIZATION AND HOUSING

- Encourage resident leadership by informing, involving, and engaging people in decisions that impact neighbourhoods.
- Provide opportunities for collaboration on common issues among neighbourhoods.
- Maintain and improve the existing housing stock - our most affordable housing option.
- Improve access to subsidized rental housing for low-income individuals and families.

WORKFORCE PARTICIPATION

- Provide unemployed individuals with multiple pathways to meaningful skills development training and job readiness activities, integrated with follow-up supports.
- Remove policy barriers related to employment and retention within the workforce.
- Engage employers in the development of creative solutions for employment within our community.
- Provide enhanced and timely labour market information and data for the community.
